Faux Felt or Artificial Flowers
White Loop Polyester Yarn, 3.5 oz Skeins (3)
Scissors
Wire Cutters
Hot Glue Gun

## **Techniques to Know**

**Basic Wire Wrap** 

## **Instructions:**

- 1. Roll each skein of yarn into a ball that will make the yarn easier to work with and wrap.
- 2. Tuck one end of a rolled skein into a space in the 12" grapevine wreath. Wrap the yarn around and around the wreath, making sure the yarn strands are wrapped closely together so you can't see the grapevine underneath and the yarn loops are extending outward from the wreath base. Add more yarn as needed to cover the entire wreath. Once you have covered the entire wreath, trim the yarn and tuck the end into a space in the grapevine wreath.
- 3. Repeat the previous step with the 10" grapevine wreath, but this time leave a 24" tail of yarn once the wreath is covered. Use this tail to wrap an edge of the 10" wreath and an edge of the 12" wreath securely together.
- 4. Cut two 1 yd. lengths of wire. Slide 35 wood beads onto the middle of each wire. Twist the ends of the wire together to secure the beads onto the middle of the wire to form "bunny ears". Wrap the wire tails around the 10" wreath two or three times, hiding them between rows of looped yarn, to secure the "ears" in place onto the wreath. Twist the ends of wire together. Use wire cutters to trim any wire tails.
- 5. Decide which side you want to be the front of the wreath. Use glue gun to glue faux flowers in place.
- Hang and enjoy! Happy Easter!
