

Faux Corn Wreath

Supplies Needed

#40000591 Tan 12"x18" 2mm Foam Sheet (2) #40000583 Light Green 12"x18" 2mm Foam Sheet (2) #34734280 Natural 2-Ply Jute Cord, 6 oz. (1 pk) or other cord

Tools & Other Supplies Needed

Pencil Scissors Bubble Wrap Cardboard (approx. 13-14" square) Flat Paper Plates Yellow, Orange, Red, and Brown Acrylic Paint Hot Glue Gun **(*Adult Supervision Mandatory)** Corn Cob & Husk Pattern Templates (see instructions) Clear Drying Craft Glue Small Disposable Paint Brush

Techniques to Know

Basic Cutting and Gluing Hot Glue Gun Overhand Knot (See Illustration)


INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Squirt multiple squirts of yellow, orange, red, and brown acrylic paint onto a flat paper plate.
- 2. Print, trace, and cut out corn cob and husk shapes onto paper plates to make pattern pieces.
- 3. Press a piece of bubble wrap (bubbles side down) onto the paints. Continue lifting and pressing bubble wrap into the paints until covered. To make the corn kernels, carefully lift the bubble wrap and press it, paint side down, onto heavyweight white paper. (Try to cover the white paper with various colored corn kernels.) Repeat until you have enough painted paper and bubble wrap to cut out fourteen paper corn cobs and fourteen bubble wrap corn cobs. Allow the paint to dry.
- 4. Trace and cut out fourteen corn cobs from each the painted paper and the painted bubble wrap. Use paint brush to coat painted paper cobs with glue. Adhere the painted bubble wrap cobs onto the paper cobs. Allow glue to dry.

- 5. Trace and cut out seven corn husk shapes from each the tan and green foam sheets. Use glue gun to glue husks onto the fourteen cobs from the previous step to make ears of corn inside husks.
- Trace a circle approximately 10-10 ½" onto a piece of cardboard. Trace a smaller circle, approximately 7 ½"− 8" centered inside the larger circle. Cut out the cardboard to create a circle ring.
- 7. Position overlapped ears of corn in husks around the cardboard circle ring. Use hot glue gun to evenly glue the ears of corn inside husks around the cardboard circle ring.
- Cut an 8" length of cord. Bring the ends together and tie them into an overhand knot. Use glue gun to glue the knot to the back of the cardboard circle ring for a hanging cord. Trim off any excess cord tails.
- 9. Repeat step 5 and glue the husks to the back side of the wreath so they overlap and line up between the husks on the front of the wreath. (This step will give your wreath added dimension.)
